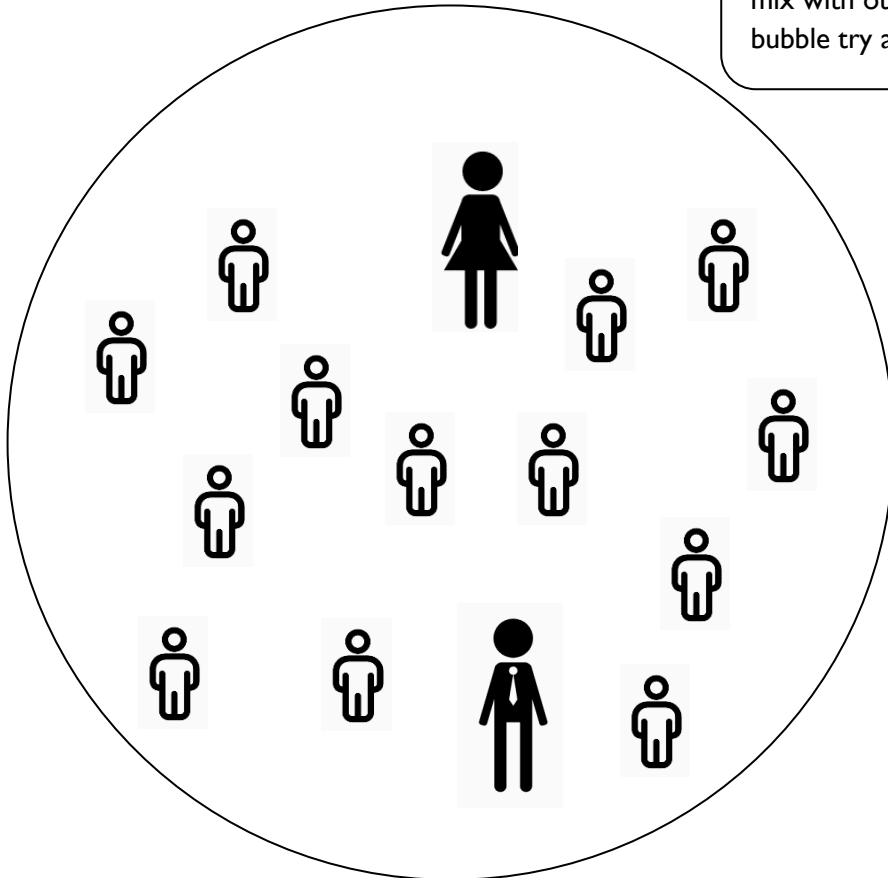


Children Returning to Lansbury Lawrence

When children begin to return to school, they will be in much smaller groups, and each group will follow a separate timetable so that they do not mix. The Government calls these 'bubbles'. The idea is that keeping small groups of children in isolated bubbles is much safer than mixing.

A 'bubble' contains up to 15 children and two adults. This bubble does not mix with other bubbles. People in the bubble try and stay apart.



The children will not come to school every day at first, this is so we can monitor the safety and wellbeing of children and staff. Each class will come to school for two days so that we can be completely confident that we have minimised the risk. We will ensure that the school gets a deep clean in between classes. Your child may not be in a bubble with their class teacher, it may be a different adult working with them, but their class teacher will ensure that all children get the high quality curriculum they need.

When should my child be in school?

Each Year group will have a new start and finish time so that we can reduce the numbers of children coming into the school at the same time. The children will only have a 30-minute lunch as play will be different. We will be giving them extra PE lessons as we know how important physical activity is for their health.

Year 6:

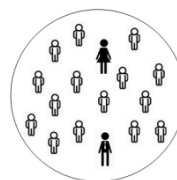
- Arrive at school between 9:00 & 9:10am
- Pick up from school at 2:45pm

How can I help the school to keep all the children safe?

1. Inform the school if your child or anyone in your household has symptoms of Covid-19
2. Do not send your child to school if they are unwell.
3. All children should come to school in a clean uniform which should be taken off as soon as they get home.
4. We will not be sharing water fountains so it will help your child to stay safe if they bring their own water bottle for drinking.
5. We will provide all resources that they need. The only thing that they should bring to school is their reading book, and only if they need to change it.
6. Any returned books must be placed in the classroom 'book return box' as soon as your child arrives in school. Books must not be passed between children without us taking steps to prepare them.
7. Drop and pick up your child at the gather points and always stay at least 2-metres apart from other families, children and staff. The parent should not enter the school building.
8. Only one parent should drop and pick up your child.
9. Remove any PPE (Face mask and Gloves) that your child is wearing before they enter the building. PPE increases risk if not worn correctly and we are not able to ensure that all children will be consistent in how they use a face mask and gloves.

How will school keep my children safe?

1. Children will be in a small group bubble so they don't come into contact with lots of people. Each bubble will have its own classroom.



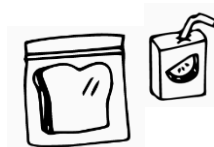
2. Classroom furniture will be spaced out



3. Children will have their own set of resources and these will not be shared.



4. Children will have a packed lunch with their 'bubble' group, either outside or in their classroom.



5. The school will have a strict cleaning regime.



6. People who are sick will not come to school. If a person becomes unwell in school they will be kept isolated in a separate safe space. If it is a child, they will be looked after by an adult wearing PPE (personal protective equipment)

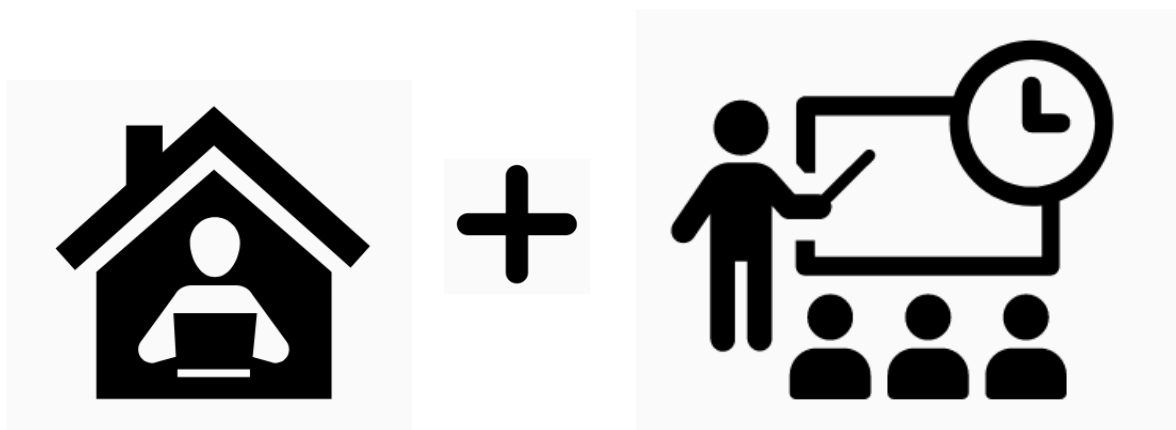


7. Everyone will wash their hands throughout the day, including whenever they move to a new location e.g classroom to outside, outside to classroom etc



What happens when my child is not in school?

Teachers will continue to plan and prepare home learning. So when your child is not at home they will be expected to complete their home learning tasks.

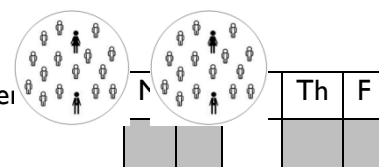


How will the school increase pupil numbers and ensure everyone is safe?

- We will monitor the situation closely, to ensure that our systems are working and school remains a safe place



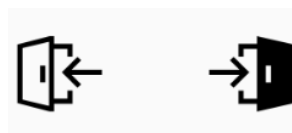
- One class from each year group will attend on Monday and Tuesday the other Thursday and Friday



- Different year groups will arrive and leave at different times



- Some year groups will use different entry and exit points



- KS1 and KS2 will use the normal gate in Ricardo Street
- Reception and Nursery children will use the Fire Gate on Ricardo Street, near Bygrove Street.
