### Key Vocabulary

**toy** - an object for a child to play with

**past** - history; time that has already happened

**present** - existing or happening now

**factory** - a building or group of buildings where toys are often made, usually containing machines

**museum** - a building in which interesting objects are stored and exhibited

**doll** - a small model of a human figure, often a baby, used as a child's toy

**teddy bear** - a soft toy bear

**material** - something a thing is or can be made from

**wood** - a natural material that comes from a tree or shrub

**puppet** - a movable model of a person or animal that is usually moved either by strings from above or by a hand inside it

**glass** - a hard material that can break easily, that is usually transparent

**transparent** - objects can be seen clearly through; a transparent material

**metal** - a hard material, that is usually shiny
