Key Vocabulary

habitat – The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism.

micro-habitat – A habitat which is small and which is different from some surrounding larger habitat.

human habitat – The environment in which human beings exist.

coastal – near a coast. A coast is the land near the sea.

forest – A large area covered mostly with trees.

grassland – A large open area of country covered with grass.

marine – Relating to or found in the sea.

polar – (of an animal or plant) living in the north or south polar region.

desert – a waterless area of land with little or no vegetation, typically one covered with sand.

climate – the weather conditions in an area.

map – a picture of an area of land showing physical features, cities, roads etc.

food chain - the transfer of energy from one species to another.
