



Parts of a flower

Key Vocabulary

root – the part of a plant which attaches it to the ground or to a support, typically underground, delivering water and nourishment to the rest of the plant.

flower – the seed-bearing part of a plant, typically surrounded by brightly coloured petals.

leaf – a flattened structure, typically green, that is attached to a stem directly or via a stalk.

stem – the main body or stalk of a plant or shrub.

petal – the segment of a flower.

seed – capable of developing into another such plant.

bud - a small growth on a plant that develops into a leaf, flower, or shoot.

trunk – the main woody stem of a tree as distinct from its branches and roots.

branch – a part of a tree which grows out from the trunk.

bark – the tough protective outer layer of the trunk, branches, and twigs of a tree or woody shrub.

blossom – a flower or a mass of flowers, especially on a tree or bush.

fruit – the sweet and fleshy product of a tree or other plant that contains seed and can be eaten as food.

berry – a small roundish juicy fruit without a stone.

seed – the unit of a plant, capable of developing into another such plant.

soil - the upper layer of earth in which plants grow.

season - the four divisions of the year; spring, summer, autumn and winter - marked by particular weather patterns and daylight hours.
